Please have your items packaged, labeled and make sure you indicate if there are nuts. It is important for us know what we are selling. Sweet Shop workers will price the items as they are brought in. We will do our best to price them accordingly, please don't be insulted by the pricing, it isn't easy. Things get hectic and we can't always tell how much time/ingredients go into each item brought in.

Have fun with it, get creative! There are tons of SIMPLE but yummy recipes on the internet, along with tons of creative ideas to make ordinary sweets into something extraordinary! I know it sounds like we are asking a lot and being picky but if our sweets stand out they will sell quicker and for more \$\$\$\$. Please take pride in your work.
